Speakers' biographies

Prof. William Molloy, MB, BCh, BAO, MRCPI, FRCPC, Prof. of Medicine University College Cork (UCC)

Following a long and distinguished career in Canada, Professor William Molloy is currently Professor of Medicine and Chair in Gerontology and Rehabilitation in UCC. Professor Molloy trained in Geriatrics at the Universities of Manitoba, Western Ontario, and McMaster University. He was Professor of Medicine and Chair in Aging at McMaster University. He returned to Ireland in 2010 to his alma mater, University College Cork, as Professor of Medicine and Chair of the newly-established Centre for Gerontology and Rehabilitation. Professor Molloy is also a practicing medical consultant in Cork University and South Infirmary Hospitals. Prof. Molloy's current research interests include advance directives, clinical trials in dementia and efficient use of acute hospital services for older people. He has published over 100 peer-reviewed articles, published several books about Alzheimer's disease and helping families cope with those stresses. To promote the autonomy of the elderly, Prof. Molloy wrote the advance health care directive, "Let Me Decide". It has had 25 editions and is published in several languages and has recently been published in Ireland for the first time. He is currently implementing a "Let me Decide" project with several care centres in Cork. The project is based on his book and research.

Eithne Ní Dhomhnaill, RGN, MSc. Director, Nursing Matters & Associates

Eithne is the Director of Nursing Matters & Associates, who specialise in providing consultancy and training to residential care facilities for older people. Nursing Matters & Associates have assisted numerous nursing homes in preparing for and responding to HIQA inspections. Eithne was a member of the HIQA group set up to establish the National Quality Standards for Residential Care Settings for Older People. She has also successfully introduced a system of effective clinical governance into the nursing home sector. Eithne's nursing career has spanned clinical practice, education and management. She has a particular interest in care of older persons and played a key role in the establishment of one of the first Nursing Development Units in Ireland during the 1990's. Eithne has also been designing and facilitating workshops for the Irish Nurses' Organisation for the last seven years and also delivered lectures in the School of Nursing and Midwifery at Trinity College Dublin. Eithne was the project manager for the 'Nursing Homes Nursing Projects' standards group involving over 110 nursing homes in Dublin and surrounding areas and was a member of the HIQA subgroup for Assessment and Care Planning Standards. Nursing Matters & Associates have developed and are currently implementing Care Monitor™, a quality and safety system for nursing homes, which includes the Care Monitor™ Clinical Governance Framework and Assessment and Care Planning System.

Gareth Kinsella, Barrister-at-Law

Gareth was educated at Terenure College Dublin. Having graduated first in his class of BBLs in UCD in 2001, he then continued his education at the Honourable Society of the King's Inns, being called to the Bar on the completion of his studies.
